What is contractors payment called?

In reading statements from the last council meeting in this column, I became somewhat confused. It was said that the payment from contractors was not called a tax. Of course, when I become confused, I always look it up. What should this charge really be called?

FEE - A fee is the price one pays as remuneration for services. In this case the contractors would be giving services, not receiving services.

LICENSE - The verb license or grant license means to give permission. The noun licensee refers to that permission as well as to the document memorializing that permission. License may be granted by a party to another party as an element of an agreement between those parties. Could this be the right one?

TAX - To tax is to impose a financial charge or other levy upon a tax payer by a state or the functional equivalent of a state such that failure to pay is punishable by

A tax is not a voluntary payment or donation, but an enforced contribution exacted pursuant to legislative authority and is any contribution imposed by government whether under the name of toll, tallage, gabel, impost, duty, custom, excise, subsidy, aid, supply, or other
