This year's volunteers for the St. Anthony Youth Group mission trip to Memphis Tenn. Youngsters plan street corner collection for mission trip

St. Anthony Youth Group and friends will continue their fundraising for their mission trip this summer with a street corner drive Saturday. They will be positioned downtown in the morning and all day at the highway intersection.

"This year we have a 21 students intending to go," said Matt Warner, a fourth year participant. "Our goal is to raise all of the money ourselves. Program fees, food, gasoline and vehicles add up really fast."

The group will spend one week in June working in poverty areas of Memphis, Tenn. They will join 300 other high school age students. They break into teams of six or seven and tackle 45 to 50 jobs, usually painting houses. They sleep on the floor of a school and eat food prepared in the school kitchen. After each work day, they have an evening of social and spiritual programs.



Hoopeston officer on paid leave after battery complaint

A Hoopeston Police officer is on paid leave while under investigation for allegedly hitting a Hoopeston man.

A 29-year-old Hoopeston man alleged the 36-year-old off-duty officer punched him in the face at about 11 p.m. Saturday at Blue Moon Saloon, 306 E. Main. The man did not seek medical treatment after the incident, according to a Hoopeston Police Department press release. The officer has been with the department since 2006.
