Hoopeston Public Library will kick off "Drivin' the Dixie" weekend with a special visit by James R. Wright, author of "The Dixie Highway in Illinois."

Wright will speak, and sell and sign copies of his book, from 6-7 p.m. Thursday at the library, 110 N. Fourth Street.

The Dixie Highway, once a main thoroughfare from Chicago to Miami, was part of an improved network of roads traversing the landscape of 10 states. A product of the Good Roads Movement of the early 20th century, construction on the highway in Illinois took place from 1916-1921.

When completed in 1921, the Dixie Highway was the longest continuous paved road in Illinois, running through parts of Cook, Will, Kankakee, Iroquois and Vermilion counties, with service stations, roadside diners and campgrounds sprouting up along the way.




