Hoopeston Area finances in good shape through end of June

Despite being owed more than \$573,000 by the state of Illinois, Hoopeston Area ended its financial year in good shape, according to business manager Mark Eigh-

Eighner provided information at Thursday night's board meeting showing all district funds were in the black except for the municipal retirement fund, which showed a negative \$15,000.

As of June 30, the end of the fiscal year, the education fund had a balance of \$476,000 after income of \$10,714,000 and expenses of \$10,238,000.

The education fund covers all expenses of educating

a notice to appear in Hoopeston City Court.


