Rossville officers bring video system home from banquet

ROSSVILLE—Two police officers who recently attended a banquet came home with a welcome piece of police equipment.

Officers Brian Norton and Marvin Dobkins attended a police-related banquet in Springfield. The two entered a drawing and came home with an electronic video system, which will be installed on the village's Crown Victoria squad

The video system has a value of \$1.200 to \$2,000, Dobkins said at Rossville police officers Brian Norton and Marvin Dobkins display components of the Monday's village board video system the department won in a drawing at a recent banquet. meeting.

"That definitely will be very helpful when you're talking about DUIs," Mayor Terry Prillaman said.

In other business, the board heard from Prillaman that the village is expected to receive a \$50,000 Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity grant for infrastructure.

Prillaman said the money was promised a year ago but "it took (legislators) a year to pass (a capital expense) bill," he said.

While the money hasn't been received, Prillaman already has a use for it: extending an eight inch water main down Attica Street to Earl Court and from Attica at the elevator, under the railroad tracks and to a new subdivision. Just the first part of the project is estimated at more than \$14,000, he said.

Along with extending water to new areas of the village, the work will also close a loop in the water system, improving pressure and volume, which will help Rossville's ISO fire rating.

Approved a request from Michael List to run a portrait studio from his property at 407 S. Grove. The request was recommended by the village zoning board.

Approved an ordinance vacating an easement on property east of Merita's. A new retail business is expected to build at the location, Prillaman said. Trustee Tia Pe-
