Fire claims Milford watering hole, other buildings spared

MILFORD—Many Iroquois County fire departments, as well as Hoopeston's were called Tuesday afternoon to the Thirsty Turtle Tavern 104 N. West Avenue.

Business owner Amber Fjeldheim went outside to get supplies and when she returned, at about 12:53 p.m., the building was filling with smoke, said Milford Fire Chief Frank Hines. Fjeldheim called 911, reporting that she heard a pop or a boom, he said.

An Illinois State Fire Marshall's investigator was on the scene early Wednesday to determine the fire's cause.

Aerial units from Hoopeston and Watseka fought the fire from the air, with Hoopeston firemen atop the neighboring Milford Building and Loan. The fire burned through a wall of the building and loan and an interior wall had to be stripped, but there was no structural damage, Hines said.

The building to the east of the fire scene, Lueke's garage, which contained at least one antique vehicle, as well as others, had no reported damage.

City officials plan to place a lien against the "tree house" to recoup the cost of demolishing it. Comstock, said the cost will be \$1,200 for demolition, plus addi-

tional cost for disposing of the waste. Mayor Bill Crusinberry said disposal costs will be in the \$3,000 to \$4,000 range.

Comstock said she is against putting a lien on the house because the city did not act promptly to tear it down, but other officials disagreed.

Crusinberry said the city cannot afford to tear down all the properties that should be taken down "unless we establish a fund. We can't go around spending money we don't have."

Fire departments spent the afternoon battling the fire, which destroyed the building. A damage estimate was not available at press time.

Cleanup at the scene started at about 6:30 p.m. or 7 p.m., Hines said, but Milford firemen remained on the scene overnight.

In all, eight departments were called to the fire. Besides Milford, Hoopeston and Watseka, responding departments included Wellington-Greer, Cissna Park, Stockland, Woodland and Sheldon.

Additionally, Milford ambulance was on the scene and Mowrey Auction Service, of Milford, provided tanker trucks, Hines said.
