Hoopeston Area grade schools list needed school supplies

Maple-first grade supplies

- 1 pocket folder
- 2 pkgs. of pencils (at least 8 in a pkg)
- 2 pink block erasers (none that go on pencil ends)
- 2 boxes of crayons (16/box - nothing larger)
- 1 4 oz. bottle of white school glue (no larger)
- 6 glue sticks (not purple or blue colored)
- 1 child's scissors w/metal blades
- 1 wet of 8 large size Crayola washable markers
- 1 or 2 regular size boxes of facial tissues
- 1 school pencil box (plastic cigar box style works well)
- 1 Paint shirt (any over-sized shirt) for art
- Gym shoes - white soled (to be left at school) for P.E.
- 1 school bag or back pack - none with wheels
- 1 complete change of clothes (in a bag with the child's name on them)

2 containers of Clorox Wipes

All items should be marked with child's name. Items not on the list may be sent home. Supplies should be replaced as needed throughout the school year.

Maple-second grade supplies

- 4 solid glue sticks (Elmer's or Rose Art)
- 2 8 oz. bottles of Elmer's White Paper glue
- 4 pink block erasers
- 2 boxes of 24 crayons (1 is for art) No glitter or fluorescent
- 1 pair child's scissors
- 2 pocket folders (no 3 ring binders)
- 2 boxes of facial tissues
- 1 pkg colored pencils (8 or 12 pack)
- 1 pencil box (cigar style box)
- 1 pair gym shoes (to be left at school) (white soles)
- 1 paint shirt (any over-sized shirt will do)
- 1 pkg 8 wide-tip markers
- 1 pack of #2 pencils (sharpened if possible) (Ticonderoga) - solid color - standard yellow
- 4 dry erase markers (2 fine point & 2 medium or chisel point)
- 1 bound composition book - not spiral
- 6 gallon size - freezer - zipper seal bags
- 1 8 oz. bottle of hand sanitizer

Notes will alert you when supplies need to be replaced.
