County Health Department returns to five-day work week after four months of furloughs

The Vermilion County Health Department has returned to a five-day work-week starting Oct. 4.

The decision by the Vermilion County Board of Health last week to reinstitute the department’s full work-week ends a four-month period where public health services were only available at the agency Monday through Thursday.

The reduction in the work-week was one of several steps taken to keep the department’s doors open despite budget shortfalls stemming from the state’s failure to pay its bills.

Public Health Administrator Shirley Hicks said she was glad to see the department return to a five-day work week, and thanked employees for their efforts under difficult circumstances and financial hardships.

“Most of our divisions are backlogged and staff have been under pressure to reprioritize their daily activities while enduring a one-day-a week furlough,” Hicks said. “This has been hard on all of us.”

In addition to closing the health department on Fridays starting on May 28, the Vermilion County Board and

Board of Health agreed earlier this year to terminate the Healthy Moms/Healthy Kids Family Case Management, Healthworks IL, Healthy Child Care, Community Care for seniors and Family Planning/STD/HIV programs – cutting 43 of the department’s 74 staff -- as part of a restructuring to keep the department open despite the state of Illinois failure to pay money owed for grant contracts with the health department in a timely fashion.

But the restructuring and furloughs allowed the health department to find a financially sustainable level, and revenues from the state have started coming in.

The week of Oct. 4 – 8 will be the first full work-week at the health department.

“We will still have to watch our finances and be very conservative with our plans,” Hicks said. “But we are grateful for the public’s patience and continued support through this devastating transformation of public health
