Monument dedicated in memory of slain Vietnam veterans

More than 40 years after their deaths, two Vietnam veterans were honored Sunday for their service to America.

In a ceremony Sunday, family and friends gathered to remember Army Spec 4 Joseph Kelnhofer, who was killed January 25, 1968 and Marine Cpl. William Gooden, who died June 12, 1969.

Cpl. Gooden's mother, Mary Helen Gooden, thanked everyone, "no matter what part they had in making this time possible." Spec. 4 Kelnhofer's uncle, Richard Kelnhofer, of Crown Point, Ind., echoed Mrs. Gooden's words, adding that while the war was lousy the way Vietnam veterans were treated on their return was "pathetic."

Keynote speaker Ben Meador echoed that sentiment, relat-

ing his own homecoming. After a 23-hour flight from Vietnam to California, Meador and fellow soldiers could not deplane because of protestors, who called the servicemen murderers and baby killers. "For 40 years, Vietnam veterans have been living under that cloud," he said. "We did what our government asked and I feel our government abandoned us."

Meador touched briefly on conflict in the community about the memorial, saying those who disagreed with the idea "need to get over it. These two men deserve their place and I'm glad to see it happen. I don't care what you thought about the war, those two guys deserve a lot of honor."

Meador said neither man thought about giving his life for his country. Each planned to marry, raise a family, live a normal life. "Neither man thought they were going to die in the jungles of Vietnam." he said.

The monument features a Vietnam era helmet, rifle and boots, along with pictures and information about Cpl. Gooden and Spec 4 Kelnhofer.

Two men are credited with spearheading the drive to get the memorial constructed. Terry Meador, VFW Men's Auxiliary president, and Mike Bane, sought donations for the project and worked with Lee Cox, owner of Cox Memorials to make the remembrance a reality

The monument is in McFerren Park, near the monument honoring PFC Jeffrey Wallace, who died in 2005 in Iraq.
