Can you imagine what problems we would have had if they all expected to use only their original language? That would have caused a reenactment of the Tower of Babel. Maybe this reasoning was best pointed out by Theodore Roosevelt. Here are his ideas on immigration in 1907:

"In the first place, we should insist that if the immigrant who comes here in good faith becomes, an American and assimilates himself to us, he shall be treated on an equal equality with everyone else, for it is an outrage to discriminate against any such man because of creed or birth place, or origin.

"But this is predicated upon the person's becoming in every facet an American, and nothing but an American... There can be no divided allegiance here. Any man who says he is an American but something else also, isn't an American at all. We have room for but one flag, the American Flag... We have room for but one language here, and that is the English language, and we have room for one sole loyalty, and that is a loyalty to the American people."

Roosevelt did not mention illegal immigrants. What do you suppose he would have advised, if he were around these days? Don't believe he would approve of making felons citizens of this country. What do you think?

There are many legal immigrants who complain they are being profiled, and checked to make sure they are legal citizens. These people should be happy that they live here, and proud to be American citizens, and eager to prove it, just like all of the immigrants did who entered this country through the doors of Ellis Island for over a hundred years. Is it that big a deal to produce identification to prove you are a citizen, if you are really a legal citizen?

People of all nationalities have their identities checked every day, and in this day and age, when terrorism is what it is, it is going to get worse, so we might just as well get used to it. All immigrants that enter this country should be treated exactly the same, which would insure equal justice for all. No one should be allowed to enter this country illegally for any purpose, and if caught should be charged as a felon, which they truly are.

If the 10-15 million illegal immigrants in this country had the same status in their country of origin, they would be in prison, until that country could not afford to keep them, then they would be turned loose on our borders, or they would become members of a drug cartel.

Yes, I have written another article on immigration. This issue is not going to go away, and we must continually fan the fires, so our country is not stolen away from our children and grandchildren. Our government continues to hide their heads in the sand, and only come up for air when it is voting time. We the people that live in the grass roots, must keep a constant vigilance to ensure
