home, planned for Route 1 across from Olympic Hardware and Anthem Chevrolet.

Both Hoopeston and Rossville have approved zoning changes for properties for the new sites. Work on the nursing home, an estimated \$6.5 million project, is expected to begin next spring.

Other stories rounding out the top 10 include:

3. Former Rossville youth minister Andy Thomas, 46, was charged March 18 with one count of criminal sexual assault-position of trust. On September 22, Thomas appeared in federal court after a grand jury indicted him on five counts of exploitation of children. Thomas, who was remanded into custody, was to go to trial November 29 but action on the case has been continued to January 5, 2011.

4. Hoopeston Area schools, along with schools throughout the state, failed to receive state funding on time. That caused the local board to lay off 15 workers at the board's March meeting. While workers were rehired into their current jobs or in new positions, funding was a concern throughout the year as the state failed to pay for its share of "mandated categoricals" such as special education and transportation. Superintendent Hank Hornbeck announced at the December meeting that the state had caught up on much of the back payment.

5. A December 30 crime did not receive much local press coverage until January 4, when Brandyn Calloway, 24, was charged with the murder of Kelly Wright, 27. Calloway, who was remanded into custody, pleaded not guilty. Jury

6. Who owns the rights to Jerky, the Hoopeston Area mascot, came into question in 2010 as a new website, Cornjerker Nation, was launched by alum Curt "Scooter" Ellis, who also designed a logo for the volunteer group Be A Part of It, that included Jerky. After a public meeting and the school board and Ellis and Be A Part of It volunteers, Ellis agreed to sign over his rights to the Jerky - which he said he worked on with creator Dick Hobbs - to the school district. District officials are currently waiting to hear from a copyright attorney about the transfer document Ellis gave to them.

7. A motel in Hoopeston, hoped for and worked on for approximately a decade, won't become a reality anytime soon. After deciding to give land at Routes 1 and 9 to a developer to construct a motel, and after having had two developers express interest, then back away, the motel idea is still in limbo. Earlier this year, city officials paid more than \$6,000 for a feasibility study. In May, officials announced the study showed a need for a 40-unit motel in Hoopeston. The report was shopped around to motel groups but current economic conditions, including tight financing, mean making the project a reality is more difficult, officials said.

 The local McDonald's restaurant, which celebrated its 34th birthday earlier this year, was set to be replaced with a new facility on Route 1 between CVS and Crown Ford. Construction was set to begin in the fall but due to reported difficulties with the developer, has not been realized. Plans are still in the works for a new McDonald's but details of the project will not be released until all plans are finalized.
Hoopeston Area Marching Cornjerkers hope the school board will give them the green light to participate in the 2010 Liberty Bowl in Memphis. Band director Wendy Ronna made an impassioned plea at the December board
