National Weather Service predicts worst storm of season

Hoopeston area residents were out in force Monday, shopping at Hoopeston IGA in preparation for a storm expected to hit Tuesday and Wednesday.

According to the National Weather Service, in Vermilion County, the storm is expected to begin with a mix of snow, sleet and freezing rain, transitioning to snow Tuesday night.

A winter weather advisory was in effect from 3 p.m. Monday to 6 a.m. Tuesday. A winter storm watch is in effect from Tuesday morning through Wednesday afternoon. According to the NWS, 12 to 20 inches of snow is possible north of I-72.

In Iroquois County, a blizzard watch is in effect from Tuesday afternoon through Wednesday afternoon, with predicted accumulation of 12 to more than 18 inches of snow, sometimes falling at two to three inches per hour.

Along with the snow, northwest winds of 15 to 25 miles per hour are predicted, with gusts to 30 and 30 miles per hour, are predicted for both counties. Whiteout conditions are expected and motorists are advised to limit driving, if at all possible.

Those who must travel are urged to have a weather emergency kit in their car, including blankets or sleeping bags, flashlight, first aid kit, high calorie nonperishable food, empty cans and plastic cover to melt snow and for sanitary purposes, paper towels, knife and cat litter or sand for traction.

Weather experts are also suggesting residents be prepared for power outages. Should power go out, residents are urged to use alternative heat forms with caution, making sure rooms are properly ventilated. Heat one room, closing off others in the house. Allow sunlight to come in during the day but block windows at night.

The most strenuous post-storm activity is shovel-

ing. Residents are urged not to shovel after smoking or eating a heavy meal; dress in layers; wear a hat, and scarf over nose and mouth and take breaks often.


