Health center receives funding for new nursing home

Colleen Callahan, state director for USDA Rural Development, announced USDA's \$6 million investment in Hoopeston Regional Health Center's new nursing home.

The low-cost loan will help the Health Center construct the new 29,000-square-foot facility at the intersection of Illinois Route 1 and McCracken Ave. This will replace its existing nursing home built in 1972.

"By helping rural communities preserve and improve their essential services, USDA can help them maintain and grow their local economies," Callahan said. "When we safeguard the infrastructure in a rural area, we make it a better place to earn a living, run a business and raise a family."

The Hoopeston Regional Health Center will use the loan to build a new facility that will provide top-quality technology, equipment, services and amenities. The 24-hour skilled nursing home will include 75 beds, two lounges, a secured patio, dining area, recreation room and room for physical, speech and occupation therapies.

The new nursing home is part of the hospital's ongoing plan to improve healthcare services for the more than 16,000 residents in its service area. In the last 15 years, the hospital has opened Country Terrace, a 30-unit senior living community; built the Charlotte Anne Russell Clinic, a medical practice building; made numerous renovations at the hospital; and opened a geriatric psych clinic. The Health Center provides essential health care service for eight towns and surrounding areas and employs more than 230 people.

"Hoopeston Regional Health Center is dedicated to being the area's community health center," said Harry Brockus, CEO. "We see the construction of this new nursing home facility as another way we can invest in our community. We believe in the value of healthcare dollars staying local and using those dollars to reinvest back into the area."


The project is being funded through Rural Development's Community Facilities program. The funding is available to public entities and non-profit organizations to build or improve essential community facilities and purchase equipment for public use in rural areas. These funds can be used to support projects such as health and child care centers, hospitals, medical clinics, assisted-living facilities, fire and rescue stations, police stations, libraries, community centers, public buildings and transportation.


