Council considers request from potential Avenue buyer

Hoopeston City Council has been asked to sign off on the sale of Avenue Broadband.

Jim Gleason, president of New Wave Communications, was at Tuesday's council meeting to discuss his company's planned purchase of Avenue, which has provided cable service in Hoopeston since 2007.

The city's contract with Avenue stipulates that the council must approve a sale of the company.

Gleason said New Wave is based in Sikeston, Mo., and operates cable companies in Missouri, as well as Illinois, Kentucky and Arkansas. The company also provide internet and phone communications to about

120,000 customers, compared with Avenue's approximate 35,000 users, he said.

Expanded basic cable prices are in the \$50 per month range, Gleason said. Phone, internet and cable combined cost about \$99 per month.

Gleason said New Wave will take the "latest and greatest" network installed by Avenue, improve what feeds into it and "leverage a better product" than what is currently available.

He also touted new internet technology the company hopes to role out that will increase download speeds to

50 mg and 5 mg uploading.

New Wave will be involved in the community but did not specify how, saying it will depend on the community. In other municipalities, the company is involved with chambers of commerce, Rotary clubs and other activities. "We kind of like to find our niche in some way that helps out," he said.

Company officials are willing to look at opening a local office. "We will absolutely take a look at that," Gleason said.

Currently, the central Illinois office is located in Taylorville and if the sale is approved, the office in Westville is expected to remain open.

Gleason said his father started a cable company in the early 1960s and that he and other founders have been together more than 20 years.

The council is expected to vote on the sale at the April 4 meeting.

In unrelated business, the council:

• Approved zoning variances for Anderson Funeral Home to accommodate renovations to the business. Variances were approved by the plan commission at a March 14 meeting and include variances to ordinances covering yard requirements-side yard; building coverage; height regulations; and projections into required yards.

- Approved moving the next meeting to April 4. It was regularly scheduled for April 5, which is election day.
- Heard from Alderman Carl Ankenbrand that some young adults were seen throwing rocks at ducks at McFerren Park. He encouraged residents who see such activity to speak up to those trying to harm the ducks.
