ROSSVILLE—One proposal was accepted, and two rejected, by village trustees Monday night.

The board approved a \$16,580 bid from Doug Crawley to replace the floor in the former village board office at 113 E. Attica. Crawley's bid included structural work for the basement, but he told the board he could fill the basement and put a concrete cap on it for the same price. The board approved filling the basement.

A second proposal from Crawley, for \$17,230 to fix the floor in a former ice cream parlor at 107 E. Attica, was rejected until an upcoming tax sale on

the building.

The third bid, from Mike Bray for \$9,311, to reroof the village office with metal roofing, was rejected as being too high. The board had previously opted to get only local bids for the work but will now open the process up to out of town contractors.

New bids will be opened at the August 15 board meeting.

In unrelated business, the board discussed residents holding continuous rummage sales. One resident, Loretta German, complained about one instance in her neighborhood, but officials said others have continuous sales.

Mayor Terry Prillaman provided history on the village's rummage sale ordinance, saying two years ago, the board approved an ordinance that required residents to get a permit for each rummage sale. The first three permits were free, but a \$25 fee was affixed to each additional sale. The ordinance was changed after residents complained.

The issue was referred to the finance committee for study. The committee will meet at 6 p.m. Thursday to discuss the matter.

In other business, the board:

• Heard from Trustee Pete Gossett about how the village can save money by getting a new copier. His research was referred to the finance committee, which will discuss it at the Thursday meeting.

• Approved a zoning board recommendation for a resident to rebuild a garage at 303 McKibben, closer than the setback.

• Referred the police policy and procedures manual back to committee for proofreading.

• Heard from Chief Bill Shannon that Officer Jason Anderson resigned from the department to accept a position See BOARD on other side
