# Hoopeston man jailed after alleged incident with firearm

# Man allegedly batters woman,

## threatens harm to police, himself

A Hoopeston man is in the Public Safety Building in Danville after he allegedly battered an unidentified Hoopeston female, then threatened to kill police and himself.

Daryl Perkins, 46, was arrested at about 6:30 a.m. Sunday in the 200 block of East Lincoln, according to a Hoopeston Police Department press release.

Police were called to the home at 3:30 a.m. for a report of domestic battery in which the suspect was armed with a pistol.

The victim had left the apartment before police arrived. She was later treated at Hoopeston Community Memorial Hospital.

Perkins allegedly barricaded himself in the apartment, when he then allegedly threatened to kill officers and himself. The Vermilion County Special Operations Group was called to the scene to assist.

Police said when Perkins surrendered, police found a semi automatic handgun in the apartment.

Perkins was taken to Hoopeston Community Memorial Hospital for evaluation prior to being transferred to the PSB, where he faces preliminary charges of domestic battery and unlawful use of a weapon by a convicted felon.

Perkins was convicted in a 1999 case for aggravated discharge of a firearm.

There was no documented history of domestic violence between Perkins and the victim, according to the press release.

In other police news:

Beth Johnson, 31, of Hoopeston, was arrested after an incident at 12:08 a.m. Sunday at Second Chance Saloon, 102 N. Market. She was charged with battery on a complaint from a 49-year-old Hoopeston woman who alleged Johnson grabbed her shirt and pulled her outside.

Johnson was released on a notice to appear in city court.

A 16-year-old Hoopeston boy was arrested at 8:54 p.m. Sunday in the 300 block of East Elm. He was charged with domestic battery and criminal damage to property on a complaint from a 19-year-old Hoopeston woman who alleged the boy pushed her and broke the window to her vehicle.

The boy was taken to the Public Safety Building in Danville to await arraignment.
