Former resident's Cornjerkers novel to be published in 2013

BLOOMINGTON— The Dailey Swan Publishing Company of Pinole, Calif., is proud to announce that they will publish David Theobald's first novel entitled, *"Cornjerkers."* His book is scheduled for publication in 2013. However, no official release date has been established yet. Theobald was born and

until 1961 when his fam-

ily moved to California. Eventually the family returned to the Midwest, settling in Hoopeston. "*Cornjerkers*," the saga of Hoopeston's class of 1968, is a story of best friends -- Schatzie, Pottsie, Punkinhead and Theo -- and old time family values still alive in the tumultuous Sixties. The fall of '67 was a time of new beginnings, a time for questioning. Television was filled with the horrors of war, political upheaval and campus protests, and the friends found themselves perplexed teens confronting






