## Show me the money: leaders wonder when state will pay up

"Show me the money" sums up the tone of a town hall meeting Wednesday between civic leaders and state Rep. Jason Barickman.


Barickman, currently representing the 105th District and seeking the state senate seat from the 53rd Senate District, fielded questions from city, school and hospital leaders about the state's failure to pay its bills in a timely manner.

Hospital CEO Harry Brockus told Barickman he was "ok with" and even promoted Gov. Pat Quinn's decision to raise taxes by two percent, thinking the extra money would help the state decrease borrowing and pay bills on time. "That didn't happen," he said.

The state owes about \$800,000 to Hoopeston Regional Health Center for the nursing home, hospital and physi-

cian services dating back to July, Brockus said. "If we're not paid the back bills by June 30, it's going to be a problem."

Barickman said there is no timetable for the state to



While Quinn wants to borrow money to pay the debts, downstate Republicans are, for the most part, against it. Treasurer Dan Rutherford has a borrowing plan that may be "swallowable" to legislators, depending on the payoff time.

Aside from the money owed to schools, Hoopeston Area Superintendent Hank Hornbeck is also upset about Quinn's failure to pay regional superintendents-a move Barickman is also unhappy with, saying the position is mandated by statute, but then not

funded. However, he added, this may be a good time to review things mandated by the state that the state does not fully fund.

The \$9 billion to pay regional superintendents is in the \$32 billion budget. The issue may come up in the October veto session. "I would presume I'd vote in favor of (the override)," he said.

Barickman also fielded questions about the state employee pension system, which, he said, needs to be reformed; tort and Workman's Compensation reform, which he favors; the state gambling bill, which Barickman said will need 71 votes to override Quinn's veto. If Quinn "tinkers with" the bill, it will probably collapse, he said.

Barickman is running for the senate district against incumbent Shane Cultra. His decision has nothing against Cultra, he said. "I believe I can make a difference," he said.
