Cultra sponsors bill mandating drug testing for Medicaid

Citing a need to reform the Illinois entitlement system to help rein in the fastest growing segment of the state budget, State Sen. Shane Cultra (R-Onarga) is sponsoring legislation to require drug testing for public aid benefits.

"People often stop me on the street and ask, 'what are you doing to help solve the budget problem?' Well here is one small solution," Cultra said. "

Cultra has filed Senate Bill 2500, which would require drug screening as a way to receive Medicaid benefits. The legislation will ask for an initial drug test upon applying for Medicaid and also subsequent random tests for current recipients. Nursing homes would be exempt.

"We will not rush this proposal through, we will obviously be concerned with the costs associated with the actual drug tests and how this will affect the state's abil-

Blue Devils win homecoming game, defeating HA 56-29

Hoopeston Area has to win its next two games to make it to this year's playoffs, after suffering a 56-29 defeat to Bismarck-Henning in the Blue Devils' homecoming game.

The Cornierkers were scoreless the first quarter. while BH tallied 28.

In the second quarter, Aiden Berg hit Zachary Drollinger for a 63 yard TD, followed by Terrence Poke returning a Bismarck kick-off 80 yards for another touchdown. Robert Irvin had a 68 yard kick return, which turned into another TD when Drollinger scored again.

Connor Cline added to the total, catching a 79 yard touchdown pass.

Poke was 16 for 44 rushing on the night, while Irvin and Drollinger each two for six. Nick Papanek was 1 for 14 and Coty Coon was six for -3.

Poke was five of 14 passing, with 86 yards and a TD. Berg was one of two for 63, with one TD and one interception.

In receptions, Irvin was three for six, while Cline

had one for 79, resulting in a Cornjerker touchdown. Drollinger was two for 64.

Matthew Watson led the Cornjerkers in tackles, with 17, followed by Drollinger 14, Poke 12 Irvin 11, Papanek 10, Alex Golladay six, Cody Wilson two, and Cline, Tristan Vaughn and Jordan Varns one each.

The Cornjerkers (3-4, 2-3) will host Westville's Tigers (5-2, 3-2) Friday night.

ity to comply with federal regulations," Cultra said. "Reforming Medicaid and other public aid entitlements has to start somewhere."

Cultra noted that recent federal regulators have objected to bipartisan Medicaid reforms passed in January. One required Medicaid applicants to produce more than a single pay stub to establish income eligibility a requirement targeted at preventing fraud. But under the current federal administration, new attempts to verify Medicaid recipients are actually eligible for Medicaid is considered a "new" and forbidden eligibility restriction.

"It is ridiculous that the federal government has objected to Illinois wanting to verify eligibility requirements for Medicaid patients," Cultra said. "These are the same federal authorities that dangle the money in front of us, then turn around and tell us we can't be responsible for making sure it is spent sensibly."

SB 2500 will be introduced during the Fall Veto Session, later this month.
