## **Ghostly tale about ghost towns of north Vermilion County**

Tom Sweeney was driving home from Gordyville one day when a ghost appeared in his car. After the social pleasantries, the ghost and Sweeney began talking about ghost towns of Northern Vermilion County.

That conversation that ensued will be the topic of Sweeney's presentation at Monday's Hoopeston Historical Society meeting at Hoopeston Public Library. Guests are cordially invited to attend the meeting, which begins at 6:30 p.m.

Once upon a time, Sweeney said, Hoopeston was the second-fastest growing community in Illinois, second only to Chicago. Small towns sprung up all around the area, including Prospect City, home to wealthy Chicagoans, which was located west of Hoopeston. There was Leeds, which became part of Hoopeston, as well as Weaver City, known as "the Grand Town of the Prairie," north of Cheneyville; Pellville, near Rankin; and Blue Grass, north of Potomac, among others.

Sweeney speculates on reasons why those towns disappeared, and what makes towns successful, including...you'll just have to come to the meeting to find out those answers.
