



Illinois schools failed to make AYP for two years in a row. "We don't want to make excuses, we just want to work harder every day," he said.

High school Principal Larry Maynard said 91 percent of high schools failed to make the grade.

States may opt out of NCLB standards by applying for a waiver. Illinois is applying for a waiver, Hornbeck said.
