Mayor: construction makes things 'pretty active in town'

Things are "pretty active around town," said Mayor Bill Crusinberry at Tuesday night's Hoopeston City Council meeting.

Crusinberry cited ongoing construction of the new nursing home, which he hopes will benefit other Hoopeston businesses such as retail stores, restaurants and gas stations.

Additionally, preparation work has begun on an assisted living facility being built on Route 9 at Market. Currently "dirt work" is being done while the developer awaits a city building permit, Crusinberry said.

In other activity, the roof of the old McDonald's has been removed. The roof and other distinctly McDonald's features must be removed from the structure, according to an agreement between the corporation and developer, Crusinberry said.

The developer hopes to find a new use for the building, which was vacated when the new McDonald's opened last month. The agreement with McDonald's bans the site from becoming another restaurant, Crusinberry said.

In unrelated business, the board heard from Alderman Bill McElhaney about water projects in the city, including a new water main that will go from the Main Street water department to the new nursing home on Route 1.

McElhaney, water committee chairman, said work will first be done at the nursing home site so as to keep that project on track. A four-way valve with shut-offs will be installed at Thompson. Weather permitting, the project will then move up Main Street.

A pre-bid meeting on the water project will be held at 10 a.m. November 22, he said.

McElhanev also reported that work repairing Pump 5 is nearly complete. "It was kind of like we sent it to the dentist," he said, explaining a screen had to be removed and hard water deposits cleaned from it. The \$40,000 project took about two weeks to complete and will have

Hoopeston man killed in Benton County, Ind., accident

A Hoopeston man died Saturday in an accident in rural Benton County, Ind.

According to published reports, Benjamin Adam Hardwick, 40, of Hoopeston, was driving a Stockland Grain Company grain truck eastbound on State Route 18 when Ryan Paul Wynn, 23, in a Ceres Solutions fuel tanker, was southbound on State Road 71 when he allegedly failed to yield. The grain truck broadsided the tanker and both vehicles caught fire, according to the re-

Mr. Hardwick and Mr. Wynn were both pronounced dead at the scene.



The accident occurred at 11:30 a.m. and closed both roads for several hours.

Mr. Hardwick is survived by his wife, Donna, of Hoopeston; three stop daughters, one sister, and four brothers.

Funeral service for Mr. Hardwick will be at 1 p.m. Friday at Anderson Funeral Home, Hoopeston. Burial will be in Floral Hill Cemetery, Hoopeston. Visitation will be 10 a.m.-1 p.m. Friday at the funeral home.
