# Council accepts low bid for Main Street water main project

The low bidder on a project to install a new water main to the site of a new nursing home is expected to start construction in the near future.

Cross Construction of Urbana was the low bidder, said project engineer Greg Gustafson of Foth Infrastructure & Environment, LLC.

Cross' bid of \$595,000 was "significantly less than" the project estimate of \$900,00, Gustafson told the council, adding "That raises our eyebrows initially."


Gustafson said Cross officials stand by their numbers, have met bidding criteria and are ready to tackle the project.

At a time when most construction crews are winding down for the winter, the Cross crew will be gearing up to meet the project's estimated May 12, 2012 completion date.

"We're poised and ready to go on this," said Alderman Bill McElhaney, water/sewer committee chairman.

While ready to go, McElhaney admitted getting the project done is going to be "an inconvenience for us." Winter work will create "a big mess on top of what's normally going on."

100-year-old water main. That makes the hair on the back of my neck stand up just thinking about it."

The project will run a new 10" line from the water department building on West Main westward across Route 1, then north to the site of the new nursing home.

The project was estimated at almost \$1.1 million. Of that, \$750,000 will be paid with a Community Development Assistance Program grant. The remainder will come from Tax Increment Financing and depreciation funds.

While the project is being done to accommodate the \$6 million nursing home project, the work is expected to boost water pressure for residents and businesses on the city's northwest side.

In unrelated business, the council approved purchasing a new and a used pumper fire truck, replacing existing 1978 and 79 pumpers.

The 1991 Pierce will be purchased from Sheffield Township for \$34,000.

Sutphen Corporation for \$223,726. The new truck, expected to be delivered in mid-April 2012, will have a pumping rate of 1,250 gallons per minute, 250 gallons per minute better than current trucks, said Alderman Brandon Hamilton, fire committee chairman.

While many new fire trucks run upwards of \$400,000, the city will receive a "bare bones" version that will meet the needs of the fire department while fitting in its budget.

The department has \$247,000 in accrual funds, to which \$20,000 more will be added in the new fiscal year, and an additional \$10,000 for maintenance and upkeep that can be used, Hamilton said.
