Candidate pitches conservative views with local voters

A hopeful for the 106th congressional seat made his pitch to a handful of voters Saturday.

Tom Bennett, of Gibson City, talked with about a dozen people at Fast Lanes. He is one of five Republican candidates running in the March 20 primary to represent the newly-formed district.

The 55-year-old was born and raised on a small family farm near Gibson City. He has worked for State Farm in Bloomington for 26 years and is currently an information technology manager. He is a former high school teacher in the Melvin-Sibley district, a former school board member, and is currently a trustee on the Parkland Community College board.

Bennett believes his background makes him a wellrounded candidate for the office. "My background in education, agriculture, those are important pieces.

As for why he's running, "I'm tired of what I see in Springfield," he said, adding "I can sit and complain about it or I can try to do something."

Bennett called himself "conservative in a variety of ways," saying Illinois must balance its budget, preferably by not raising taxes. After recent deals with CME and Sears to cut the 67 percent tax increase approved last year, "you know others are going to be lining up," he said. "That tells me (the tax rate) is too high."

Bennett said cuts must be made. The areas that get the most money are education, social services, such as Medicaid, and prisons.

Bennett talked about being in a gas station and watching a customer pay for doughnuts and candy bars with a LINK card, while talking on cell phone and wondered about the types of food that should be eligible on the program and whether cell phones are a "right."

He is also concerned about state pensions, which should be able to stand alone, he said.

A proponent of the Second Amendment, Bennett said he favors concealed carry. "There's nothing wrong with guns," he said. "It's party of life." Asked his opinion on the need for FOID cards, Bennett said mandated background checks should be sufficient. "Those work," he said.

Asked about issues, Bennett readily gave his thoughts. A question about casinos brought the answer, "I don't like them" because while they bring jobs and business, they have social costs. Asked about mandatory drug testing for welfare recipients, "let me ask you, is there a down side to this," he asked.

Asked about vouchers that could be used for private schools, Bennett said he would favor those. A question about another education-related issue - banning collective bargaining for teachers and other public employees - Bennett said "we'd have to talk about that. I don't like knee-jerk reactions."

Bennett's family is supportive of his run, although his 89-year-old mother "says I'm crazy," he said, laughing. More information on Bennett is available at his website, <u>thomasmbennett.org</u>.
