



The front of a building in the 400 block of West Penn that has been dug out, reportedly for parking spaces, has drawn questions from residents.

Alderwoman Sue Comstock raised the issue at Monday's Hoopeston City Council meeting, asking why the 50' area was dug out without council approval mandated by ordinance.

Mayor Bill Crusinberry said the issue probably falls under the jurisdiction of zoning officer John Holt and said he would research the ordinance.

Resident Curt Ellis said one city employee had a Facebook post that another employee approved the project. Ellis also asked why it is necessary for nine parking spots at the residence, suggesting there are "serious and significant issues (that) need to be looked at."

Ellis also suggested that the Lorraine Theatre may have closed, also based on a Facebook entry that indicated the theater might close at 12 a.m. Monday. "It would be really sad to lose that place," he said.

In other business, the council heard from Todd Harris, owner of Harris Insurance, about the dilapidated building next to his office, an issue that has dragged on. "I try to be constructive, positive," he said, "but I'm starting to lose my patience."

HEALTHCARE EDUCATION OPPORTUNITY SPONSORED BY DACC C.N.A. PROGRAM

Danville Area Community College [DACC], in partnership with Hoopeston Community Memorial Nursing Home, will host a C.N.A. class at the Hoopeston Nursing Home campus. The class runs from May 30, 2012 through August 3, 2012. Attendance is required at all class sessions.
