Barickman wins overall, Cultra carries Grant, Ross

Jason Barickman easily defeated sitting state Sen. Shane Cultra in the 51st Senate District—but not in Grant or Ross townships. And while Mitt Romney had a blowout statewide, the local race between the two was much closer.

trict, holding off four other contenders.

According to unofficial tallies, Harms treceived 3,669 votes, more than challengers Scott McCoy, with 2.643: Tom Bennett, 1889: Richard Thomas, 524; and Brian Gabor 1,168.

Harms, endorsed by former state Rep. Bill Black (R-Danville), took most of the local precincts, losing only in Grant 6 where Tom Bennett of Gibson City won by one vote.

In the only contested county race, Thomas M O'Shaughnessy defeated Deb Runyan and Eric Rosson to be the GOP candidate for recorder.
