Hoopeston street department to buy patching machine

Hoopeston City Council voted 6-1 Tuesday night to purchase a machine that is expected to make street patching last longer.

Alderman Randy Carter asked the council to approve the purchase of not more than \$50,000 for a Total Patcher system through the state bidding system.

The system is a spray injection repair system using emulsions and crushed aggregate, compared to the cold pack method currently used to patch potholes, Carter said. He expects the city to recoup its cost in five to seven years.

In making his pitch, Carter said the street/alley department currently has \$85,000 in accrued funds and that no major equipment purchases are foreseen.

Alderman Bill Goodwine, finance committee chairman, said accruals may have to be cut in the new budget and asked if Hoopeston could rent the machine when it's needed. "Does everybody have to have one of these," he asked. "I mean, why can't we all work together."

Carter again stated that the machine would pay for itself in a few years, but Goodwine suggested putting the purchase decision off until new budgets are done.

In the end, the council approved the purchase 6-1, with Goodwine being the only dissenting vote.

In other business, the council:

- Approved paying Cross Construction \$64,411.19 and \$167,834.39 for work on the water main project. Goodwine said the entire \$64,411 and about \$21,000 will be paid from city funds with the remainder coming from a grant received for the project.
- Approved Sara Jane Johnson's bid of \$30 and \$31 for live and artificial urns for the spring perpetual care program.
