

Cold facts of Titanic sinking to be told from Iceberg's view

Blame it on the iceberg. Or, maybe not.

To mark the 100th anniversary of the sinking of the Titanic, Hoopeston Public Library will present an original Readers' Theatre production, which explores the tragedy from a different angle.

"The Iceberg Version" will be performed at 7 p.m. Thursday, April 12, in the library's lower level meeting room. There is no admission charge but tickets are required and may be picked up at the library's main desk. Seating is limited.

The cast includes Mike Pemberton as The Iceberg, Hank Hornbeck as the narrator, Anne Burton, Chrystal Johnson, Linda Sheppard, Diana Judy and Tom Cahan. The unique script, written by Tom Sweeney, intersperses facts and conjecture about the last hours of the ill-fated voyage from the point of view of the iceberg which claims it didn't mean to do it - and also through

DANVILLE-A free electronics collection will be held from 7:30 a.m. until 2:30 p.m. on Saturday, April 21 at Bryant Industries, 1406 Warrington Avenue, west of Danville. The event is jointly sponsored by the Vermilion County Health Department, Bryant Industries and Keep Vermilion County Beautiful.

Residents may bring their broken, obsolete or unwanted electronic items to the Bryant Industries facility on April 21 so that they can be recycled at no cost. "Even old and broken electronic items have components that can be recycled and reused, and other components that can be toxic," said Public Health Administrator Shirley Hicks.
