Upperclassmen get lesson in aftermath of drinking, driving

Hoopeston emergency medical personnel were called Thursday afternoon to Hoopeston Area High School, where a car rear-ended and went under a van. Four students were taken to Hoopeston Community Memorial Hospital, one was air lifted and a sixth was pronounced

dead at the scene.

Luckily for all of them, they were able to peel off their stick-on "injuries," wash their faces and head back to class after the demonstration of a post-Prom drunk driv-

Lesson continued from other side

ing accident, sponsored by the school district.

In the scenario, Alex Golladay and some friends were heading back to Hoopeston after a Prom dinner in Danville when Golladay rear-ended a van. Golladay's car ran underneath the van, causing serious "injuries" to people in both vehicles, including Holly Mullen, Gabby Carter, Gina Werkheiser, Brandon Umbanhowar, and Ross Lange, who "died."

HA juniors and seniors watched the scene unfold, as ambulances and Hoopeston Fire Department rescue vehicles raced to the bus area behind the high school. As firemen used the Jaws of Life to cut open the vehicles, parademics readied backboards and other equipment to treat the victims. Most were taken by ambulance to the local hospital, but Umbanhowar was treated to a helicopter ride after his "injuries" were deemed serious enough to require

trauma center care.

Once the injuries were tended to, Golladay, portraying the drunk driver, performed—and failed—field sobriety tests administered by Illinois State Trooper R.L. Woodard as Vermilion County Sheriff's Deputy Dan Auterman explained the processes of the field tests and subsequent


Paramedic Joe Garrett, of Hoopeston Emergency Medi-

cal Service, outlined the scene for students at the beginning of the demonstration, then summed it up at the end. "Our goal is for you to have a safe Prom. an alcohol-free Prom," he said. "Have a good time...and don't forget to wear your seatbelts."
