## Hoopeston to seek price cut for asphalt work, new bids to extend Route 1 water main

Lowball guesstimates from a previous engineer have city officials working to get a lower price on resurfacing West Main Street and new bids to extend a water main south on Route 1.

The council discussed both issues at Tuesday's Hoopeston City Council meeting, after Alderman Bill McElhaney said change orders needed to be approved for the water main program from the water department building to the new nursing home.

Of a total of \$168,127, only \$38,370 in overruns was approved by the council, covering three service lines, taps, and increased concrete from six inches to eight inches.

The remaining roughly \$130,000 is the actual cost of resurfacing the north side of Main Street after the water main project is complete.

Mayor Bill Crusinberry said a former engineer with Foth Engineering guesstimated the cost at \$85,000. However, the engineer did not clear the amount with Cross Construction, which is doing the work.

The council did not approve paying the overrun. Offi-

cials will meet with Cross representatives to try to get the cost lowered.

Another guesstimate has officials deciding to seek new bids on extending the Route 1 water main south past Crown Ford.

Under the original contract, the main goes from the new nursing home across from Anthem Chevrolet to Main Street. However, officials hoped to run it further south, solving main break problems in the area. The extension was estimated at \$150,000 to \$160,000 but Crusinberry said that after some studying, engineers are now saying the cost is \$183,000 plus a \$22,000 contingency fee.

Alderman Randy Carter suggested the work be rebid, which was approved by the council.

In other business, the council:

approved a state-submitted ordinance regarding flood plains in the city. The ordinance and new flood plain
