# Memorial Day program to be held at Floral Hill Chapel

Hoopeston's annual Memorial Day observance will begin at 10:30 a.m. Monday near the Floral Hill Chapel.

The event will begin with a musical prelude by Hoopeston Area High School chorus, followed by a welcome from Mayor Bill Crusinberry. The opening prayer will be led by the Rev. Rick Branaman, pastor of First Christian Church, Disciples of Christ, Hoopeston.

Crusinberry will then lead the audience in the Pledge of Allegiance, followed by the introduction of Wendy Ronna, Hoopeston Area High School band director, and Rachelle Morgeson, choral director. The National Anthem will then be played.

LT Garrett, a veteran who recently returned from Afghanistan, will give the keynote speech, followed by the Armed Forces Melody. Veterans are encouraged to stand when their branch is noted in the music. After the song, all veterans will come forward to be recognized.

The Rev. Branaman will given the benediction, followed by 30 seconds of silence for those who gave their lives for the freedom of our country. The firing squad will then perform the salute to the dead
