Hoopeston employees feel pinch of budget balancing cuts

Some Hoopeston employees are feeling the pinch of officials tightening the city's belt to balance the budget.

At Tuesday's Hoopeston City Council meeting, Mayor Bill Crusinberry said the status of some employees' status has been changed, while others agreed to cut hours or eliminate benefits to help the city make ends meet.

Two positions currently vacant - one in the street/ alley department and the other in water/sewer - will not be filled, Crusinberry said.

Two others - one each in parks and cemetery departments - will be reclassified as seasonal. That change will go into effect in July, Crusinberry said.

A second parks department employee has given up his insurance.

In the communications/police departments, four dispatchers have each given up hours each pay period to accommodate a fifth dispatcher recently hired and the next officer to resign will not be replaced, Crusinberry said.

While budgeting has been tight for three years, Crusinberry said officials started the process with a projected \$320,000 deficit based on individual de-

partment requests and accrual funds for major purchases, such as police cars and fire trucks. The council cut line items to about \$180,000 but the only way to slash some costs, specifically health insurance, was to make personnel cuts.

Health insurance costs rose about \$100,000 over last year, and were expected to cost the city more than \$600,000 this year, Crusinberry said.

Employees pay less than 10 percent of those costs, with the city picking up the rest, he said.

Additionally, the city has lost about \$100,000 on state income tax, and while sales tax is holding steady, the state is four to six months behind in paying it to the city.

Crusinberry estimated decreased insurance costs at \$81,000 for 10 months, with another \$79,000 saved in wages and about \$13,000 in employee-related costs.

After figuring in all the cuts, officials still had to take about \$100,000 from reserve funds to balance the budget, Crusinberry said.

This year's budgetary news was not all bad for employees, however. Along with having to pay more See BUDGET on other side
