Healthcare foundation presents \$206,000 donation

Hoopeston Area Healthcare Foundation on Thursday presented Danville Area Community College with the second largest contribution in its fundraising drive that began in 2010.

Saying DACC offers a good selection of training for healthcare careers, foundation president Kevin Moore presented Dr. Alice Jacobs, DACC president, with a check for \$206,000.

Of the total, \$50,000 is earmarked for the proposed DACC satellite campus in Hoopeston. The remaining \$156,000 will be used for scholarships in the healthcare field.

Jacobs said that while on the way to Hoopeston Thursday, she thought about the students who drive from to DACC everyday - and to those potential students were not able to attend because they could not get to Danville. The foundation's contribution will allow DACC to serve more area students in a manor more convenient to the students, she said.

Tracy Wahlfeldt, DACC Foundation executive director, said DACC working with the healthcare foundation and other Hoopeston groups "typifies what community colleges are all about," and thanked those responsible for "opening the door to a world of possibilities."

The gift does not mean Hoopeston Area Healthcare Foundation is disbanding, said Bill Nicholls, member of the healthcare foundation and DACC foundation board.

The foundation will maintain a smaller balance to cover operating expenses and will fundraise to add to the scholarship fund, he said.
