Trustees take steps to sell vacant lot, worry about building

ROSSVILLE—Village trustees approved taking steps to sell a vacant lot while worrying about the condition of a downtown building.

At Monday's village board meeting, trustees approved selling the lot, at 113 Maple, as surplus property. Mayor Terry Prillaman said that in order to sell the lot as surplus property entails "a lot of hoops to jump through," including publishing a legal notice once weekly for three weeks and taking sealed bids on the property.

Prillaman said officials do not need to accept any bids received and may, at a future date, sell the property to someone who makes an offer.

The village has spent nearly \$11,000 on the lot, paying back taxes, demolition costs and legal fees to get possession of the property, Prillaman said.

The 66' x 132' lot is large enough to build a small house but Prillaman guesses that whomever purchases it will also want to purchase the lot behind it. That lot is not village-owned.

In other business, Prillaman said the top of the former Gallerie Romantique building, at 101 S. Chicago, is separating from the building next to it by as much as 2.5 inches. A letter will be sent to the owners and if it is not repaired, the village may take legal action against them.

Trustee Pete Gossett asked if the village is "opening a can of worms" because of the number of buildings that have fallen into disrepair. Prillaman said the village may be but will start with what he considers the worst one first.

In related discussion, Gossett and trustee Dick Queen said some work done on a village-owned building at 107 E. Attica needs to be fixed before the village pays the contractor.

Queen said plaster is falling off in a couple of places and other plaster has hairline cracks in it. Also, a pile of debris was left at the site.

Additionally, Gossett said that, while it wasn't in the contract, he was disappointed that employees of Contois Masonry & Concrete Contractors of Donovan did not notify officials of the condition of the building's interior.

In May, trustees approved hiring Contois for the masonry work and C and C General Contractors of Momence to install a metal roof.

In unrelated business, trustees:

- Approved changing the village's two emergency sirens to narrow band at a cost of \$4,915, based on a proposal from Barbeck Communications. Trustees will have to amend the budget, which did not include the project, which must be done for the sirens to work, Prillaman said.
- Trustee Nancy Null said if they hurry, trustees can apply for a USDA rural development grant to cover


