Board approves corrective action plan, varsity cut policy

Some activities will be curtailed at Hoopeston Area schools as a means of having more instructional time.

At Thursday evening's meeting, the school board approved the district's corrective action plan. The plan covers field trips, PBIS celebrations, assemblies, Christmas programs and other activities.

Field trips, designated as activities outside Hoopeston. will be limited to one per building per year. John Greer will include Outdoor School and DARE trip to the Public Safety Building, while the high school will keep anatomy class trip to DACC, special education junior/senior trip to DACC for transition conference; and junior to College Day at DACC.

PBIS (Positive Behavioral Interventions and Supports) celebrations will be allowed 4-7 times, approximately one hour long and not to interfere with math/reading instruction. Optional booster/pop-up celebrations may be 25-30 minutes long as data reflects. Boot camps and refreshers are not included and are considered part of the PBIS instruction.

Assemblies are expected to be educational and tied to curriculum. The day before Christmas can be used as flexible time in all buildings.

Christmas programs for kindergarten through fourth grade will be moved to a Sunday afternoon, different from the middle/high school concert. Each entire grade will sing one to two songs, culminating in one song sung by all grades at the end of the program.

John Greer band and chorus tour has been changed so that it will remain at John Greer with Maple and Honeywell students coming to the school for the concert at a time to be determined by John Greer staff.

Some things have been cut from the calendar, including an assembly for Sweetcorn Festival queens, as well as Halloween and Valentine's Day parties. Birthday

treats will be allowed in grades kindergarten-fourth during milk break time only. Passing out treats outside the classroom is not allowed.

Fifth and sixth grade will have birthday recognition during recess.

Activities that will be kept/unchanged include Ag in the Classroom, Traveling Naturalist, hearing/vision/ dental screenings, school pictures, restroom breaks and Veterans Day assembly.

Activities that will be kept but timing adjusted include bullying presentations, which will take place during PE or lunch recess; Jump Rope for Heart, during PE; Airwave, moved to end of the year celebration; fundraiser assemblies, moved to PE or lunch recess; Big Brothers/ Big Sisters and breakfast, kept but need better communication with high school teacher on schedules and times for kids and breakfast; Book Fairs, held during Grandparents Day or after school.

Also, Grandparents Day will be held on the same day for both Maple and Honevwell, with one serving breakfast and the other serving lunch. The DARE graduation will be kept but will not include the sixth grade band and yearbook pictures will take place during lunch recess.
