## Hoopeston Area district ends year on good financial note

Hoopeston Area School District ended the year in good financial shape, thanks to estimating high expenses and low income.

Business manager Mark Eighner presented an end-of-the-year report at Thursday's board meeting. The education fund - "sort of the pulse of how your district is doing" - ended the year \$658,000 to the good.

Other funds and their balances for the year include:

Building	\$204,000
Bond/Interest	\$0
Transportation	-\$60,000
Municipal Retirement	-\$16,000
Working Cash	\$85,000
Tort	-\$11,000
Life Safety	\$39,000

Eighner said changing fuel costs and state reimburse-

ment rates means the district will have to keep an eye on transportation costs. While HA received four payments this year, two of those were for last fiscal year, he said.

Superintendent Hank Hornbeck said the state will lower the rate of reimbursement for transportation, from the current 54 percent to probably 50 percent.

State aid will also be cut, from the 95 percent received last fiscal year to a likely 89 percent, "an ouch for everyone," Hornbeck said.

Additionally, regional offices of education will remain at the current level next year and will be paid from the corporate personal property replacement tax, he said.

In related business, the board approved bids for fuel from Illini FS, bread products from IBC/Wonder and milk from Prairie Farms, and approved depositories for district funds.
