New school year brings changes to Hoopeston Area

Change can be fun, different, difficult, necessary and sometimes a little scary. To help improve our schools, Hoopeston Area School District will implement several changes when school starts in August. Some changes are big, while others are small. Some you may agree with, others you may not. However, our main goal is to increase classroom instruction time for our students. We believe increasing instructional time for our students will lead to improved standardized test results, as well as students who are better prepared for the future.

During the past several months, school district staff met to address deficient academic areas. They have written action plans which include ideas to increase classroom instruction time. The changes that you will see this fall include:

Field Trips: A "field trip" will be considered anything outside of Hoopeston

One field trip per elementary building.

Elementary trips to McFerren Park at the end of the school year will been eliminated

PBIS K-8 Celebrations:

School-Wide Celebrations will not to interfere with core instruction (reading and math)

Christmas Program for K – 4:

Will be moved to a Sunday afternoon

John Greer Band and Chorus Tour:

One performance for all K-4 students – Maple and Honeywell will go to John Greer for the concert
