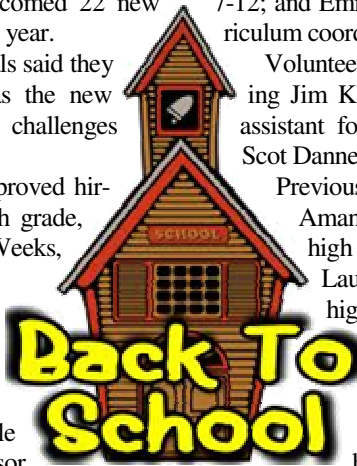
The board also approved transferring Amy Linares from Maple Title 1 aide to community liaison for grades
