



City officials will review ordinances pertaining to soliciting after a complaint at Tuesday's Hoopeston City Council meeting. Chervl Edwards told officials that a solicitor selling

children's books recently made two appearances at her home, one at 8:30 p.m. and the second at about 8 a.m. When asked for a business card, the man asked why she wanted one and also grilled her about neighbors who might have children. The man did not show identification, she added.

Attorney Scott Perkins said a pair of solicitors has been traveling throughout Vermilion and Champaign counties, trying to sell a line of children's educational products during the summer.

Edwards asked the council to look at setting hours people may solicit, as well as requiring proper identification.

In unrelated business, Alderman Bill Goodwine reported that the finance committee is looking to change medical insurance carriers if one can be found that provides about the same current coverage at a lower price.

Officials are working with Gallagher Benefit Services Inc., headquartered in Itasca, to find an affordable solution that will also meet changes mandated as aspects of the federal Affordable Care Act kick in.

Currently, the city pays upwards of \$500,000 for employee coverage, Goodwine said.

Members of the finance committee plan to have an impact meeting with members of each department within the next week. If a new plan is selected, a signup meeting will be held at a later date.

In unrelated business, the council:

• Tabled action on a request by Alderman Carl Ankenbrand for a new swimming pool liner. Ankenbrand said he had questions to ask of Spear Corp. before bringing the matter to a vote.

• Also heard from Ankenbrand that the city consider adding an ordinance about bounce houses on city property. Some communities ban the attractions, while others require owners to have insurance covering them on city property.

• Heard from Alderwoman Sue Comstock that the city's plan commission recommended a conditional use for Natosha Menschel to operate a beauty shop in her home. The commission also recommended a change in the conditional use for Anderson Funeral Home to allow the drive-through area for people to be let out of vehicles under an awning.

Decisions on both are expected at the September 18 meeting.
