NEW YORK, Sept. 6, 2012 -- /PRNewswire/ -- Teasdale Quality Foods, Inc., a leading manufacturer of Hispanic foods and the largest producer and marketer of canned hominy and beans in California, announced September 6 that it has acquired Hoopeston Foods, Inc., a major producer of conventional and organic canned dried beans in the Midwestern U.S. Terms of the acquisition were not disclosed.

Its customers include contract manufacturers, grocery retailers, wholesalers, and the U.S. government.
