



DAR chapter, library mark Constitution Week Sept. 17-23

The Barbara Standish Chapter of the Daughters of the American Revolution (DAR), along with Hoopeston Public Library, are encouraging people to take note of Constitution Week this week.

This year marks the 225th signing of the U.S. Constitution.

The library has a special display of books about the creators who had tenacity in defending the document, the Bill of Rights and various modern interpretations. Of special interest is a selection of DVDs which explore key Constitutional concepts.

In addition, Mayor Bill Crusinberry has issued a city-

wide proclamation for Constitution Week and Hoopeston Area schools will have educational programs, as well.

The DAR started the tradition of celebrating the Constitution. In 1955, the group petitioned Congress to set aside September 17-23 annually for the observance of Constitution Week. President Dwight D. Eisenhower signed it into law on August 2, 1956.

America functions as a republic under the Constitution, the oldest document in active use that outlines the self-government of a people.

"We must remember and teach that those who wrote the Constitution believed that no government can create freedom, but that government must guard freedom rather than encroach upon the freedoms of its people," said Merry Ann T. Wright, DAR President General. "The constitution by itself cannot guarantee liberty. A nation's people can remain free only by being responsible citizens who are willing to learn about the rights of each arm of government and require that each is accountable for its own function."
