Refurbishing Hoopeston water storage will be expensive

For several years, Hoopeston officials have said the city's ground and elevated water storage tanks need to be repaired.

At Tuesday night's meeting, city council members learned the price tag of those improvements will be more than \$2 million.

Larry Johnson of Foth Infrastructure and Environment, told the council that a plan to repair and recoat existing tanks and construct a smaller contact tank for additional ground storage, will cost "a little more than \$2.3 million."

cover at least some of the cost but Johnson said "the painful fact" is that few grants are available. Instead, he suggested the city get a low-interest loan from the Illinois Environmental Protection Agency (IEPA).

IEPA loans may carry a 2.5 percent interest rate although the current rate is 1.95 percent, Johnson said. Just the difference in interest rates would save the city about \$12,000 per year in payments.

Officials wondered whether other projects—such as a new, large elevated tank or replacing 100-year-old water mains, might also be included but Johnson said IEPA See WATER on other side
