The only thing worse than kids bullying are adults who should know better! I have heard some very strange stories but real of people actually coming up to a stranger and letting them know they are fat and what to do about it! How thoughtless and rude. (As if they don't know?!)

My problem as a senior is hereditary-surprise! Just before seniorhood came up, pounds and more pounds. High triglycerides that build themselves on sugar, not fat, which I found out years later which side it came from, plus I knew adult onset diabetes runs in our family. Only a strict diet keeps heart attacks, strokes and so far diabetes away. And anyone who knows me, knows I will have treats but they are not frequent and especially lately since I cannot walk well.

I thank God for healing my cholesterol and keeping my glucose normal but remember, we have to do our part. I know it is not easy but if you don't have a serious health problem, ask for prayer and emotional support.
