Hoopeston Public Library will celebrate Teen Read Week October 15-20 with a variety of special activities centered around the theme, "It Came from the Library." The events are aimed at encouraging middle and high school students to get into the library and read for the fun of it.

One highlight will be a movie for teens only at 2:45 p.m. Wednesday. Featured will be the recent thriller based on the best-selling Suzanne Collins' book trilogy about life in a future North America. Teens are pitted against each other in annual "games" that are actually a battle to the death. The movie is free but teens are asked to pick up tickets at the library's main desk prior to the before Wednesday. Free popcorn will be served.

After the movie, the library's book sale room will be opened for a "Teens Only" sale. Teens are invited to

purchase a bag of books for just 50 cents per bag.

Several Special young adult book displays will also be featured at the library during the week.

Tom Sweeney is coordinating the library's special emphasis for Teen Read Week. He hopes the events will show parents and community members everything the library can offer young people.

"Between school, work and other activities, teens have more things than ever to occupy their time," Sweeney said. "It's important that we show them reading is also something fun and relaxing they can do for free. And reading for fun can translate into better performance in school."

Sweeney urged families to visit the library during Teen Read Week, or any time, to learn more about many services available. In addition to books, library cardholders can check out movies, music CDs, magazines, audio and digital books, as well as take advantage of the library's computer services and free Wi-Fi.
