Hoopeston DAR members hear stories of Illinois history

Members of Barbara Standish Chapter NSDAR attended the Illinois State District III meeting at Savoy United Methodist Church last month.

The program given by Georganne Spurling Marty, Honorary Vice President General, was "Two Illinois Stories."

The first story was about Al Capone's lawyer, Easy Eddie, who was responsible for keeping Capone out of jail. Easy Eddie had a son and although he gave him everything he could want, including teaching him right from wrong, he couldn't give him two important things. Easy Eddie realized the two things he wanted to give his son the most - a good name and a good example - he couldn't give so he went to the authorities to make things right and agreed to testify against Capone. Easy Eddie died a year later shot full of bullet holes.

The second story was of a young pilot, Lt. Commander Butch O'Hare, a fighter pilot on the USS Lexington in WW II. The young pilot was leaving the ship to go on a mission with his squadron but noticed he didn't have enough gas to get back so turned around to return to the ship. On his way back, he noticed a Japanese squadron bearing down on the fleet. The fleet was unaware of the Japanese and were defenseless.

O'Hare made the decision to attack the squadron. He dove into the formation of Japanese planes and fired until he ran out of ammo downing five planes, then proceeded to clip wings and tails until the Japanese squadron left. He limped back to his ship. The camera on his plane told the story of his accomplishments.

Lt. Commander O'Hare became the first WW II aviator to receive the Medal of Honor and was the first U.S. Navy flying ace of World War II in 1942. O'Hare Airport in Chicago is named after him and a statue honoring him is located between Terminals one and two.

He died a year later leading a nighttime attack on Japa-See DAR on other side
