Weinard updates council on issues affecting Hoopeston

Several issues on the county level that will affect Hoopeston were updated by Vermilion County Board Chairman Gary Weinard.

Weinard made a courtesy call at Tuesday's Hoopeston City Council meeting. Areas he discussed included:

•A new buyer for property south of Hoopeston that is permitted for Hoopeston Wind farm. Apex Wind Corp., of Virginia, purchased the property from GDF SUEZ in February. GDF had purchased the property from International Power.

The site, situated about three miles east of Route 49 to near Hubbard Trail Country Club, is permitted for 43

wind turbines with a possible expansion of two more, Weinard said, adding the site's county permit, approved in 2011, is valid until April 14. Federal tax credits are also available. Weinard said if something is going to happen on the site, he expects it to be in the next six to eight months.

- •In a related issue, Weinard said some county resident want the county board to make its wind farm policies stricter in the areas of setbacks, noise, shadow flicker and decommissioning. Existing standards are on the county website; anyone with suggestions can call the county board office and leave their information.
- •Vermilion County has hired Bruce Harris & Associates of Batavia for new orthophotgraphic maps of the county. The map will be an aerial photograph corrected for uniform scale and should be available around July, he said.
- •Vermilion Manor Nursing Home. Weinard said the county has hired a broker to find a buyer for the facility, which receives about \$700,000 in tax revenue annually.
- •Illinois, which "continues to be a poor business partner" with the county. Motor fuel tax funds are down about six percent this year and the state continues to be in arrears for Medicaid and other services.

There are 27 chapters in this chronologically presented article, and hopefully we can present it in such a way that it is understandable and easy to read, and that you will look forward to reading in the next issues. The only thing else that I want to add today, is the very reason this DVD and this organization is in existence is to promote a national economic reform. This eliminates banks being able to loan out another 80% of money that isn't even there. That is exactly what the Central Banks (Federal Reserve Bank) counts on to be able to invest and cause inflation to rise nearly 90% each year.

This reform act is constitutional, otherwise Abraham Lincoln could not have printed up greenbacks during the Civil War. Even before our war for independence, our colonies printed up what is called colonial script. Benjamin Franklin wrote this about script which the British banded before the war:

"The Colonies would gladly have borne the little tax on tea and other matters had it not been that England took away from the Colonies their money, which created unemployment and dissatisfaction. The inability of the colonists to get power to issue their own money permanently out of the hands George III and the international bankers was the prime reason for the Revolutionary War."
