

Hoopeston approved for next step in water storage work

The Illinois Environmental Protection Agency has granted a permit for Hoopeston to move forward with plans to refurbish its water storage tanks.

At Tuesday's Hoopeston City Council meeting, engineer Mike Streff, of Foth Infrastructure and Environmental, asked the council to approve several documents that will lead to getting bids on the work, including emptying each tank, recoating the interior and painting the exterior and replacing needed components for both the

aerial and ground storage tanks.

Those documents included a loan application to the IEPA to show the city "is serious about this project," Streff said. Another document authorizes Foth to seek bids on the city's behalf, which Streff recommended even though bid approval has not been granted by IEPA because companies who perform such work are lining up their summer schedules.

Ankenbrand, Strawser vie for Ward 2 alderman position

Hoopeston's Ward 2 voters will have a decision to



make in Tuesday's election as incumbent alderman Carl Ankenbrand is being challenged by Charles (Chuck) Strawser.

Ankenbrand. 48, first sworn in as alderman in 2002, is chairman of the city's parks committee. He sees deteriorating infrastructure - including the swimming poor and civic center - and finding funding for repairs, as the biggest issue facing the city. If re-elected, An-

kenbrand said he will continue to work with other council members on funding improvements.

Ankenbrand said he brings knowledge and experience to the position if re-elected.

Despite tight funding, Ankenbrand said city parks are kept in shape and credits parks superintendent Eugene Warner with doing "an outstanding job of keeping them looking beautiful."

A graduate of Southern Illinois University-Edwardsville, he has a bachelor of science degree in studio art with a K-12 certificate to teach art. He is an 18-year-teacher in the Hoopeston Area schools, currently teaching elementary art. Additionally, he coaches high school wrestling and girls summer softball and "love(s) the outdoors and all the outdoor opportunities that Vermilion County offers."

Ankenbrand is married to the former Kelly Richards and has a daughter, Taylor, and two stepchildren, Samantha and Nathan.

Strawser, 46, was graduated from Hoopeston Area High School and attended DACC, where he studied landscape construction. He is employed by Carlson Landscape Service.

This is Strawser's first run for elected office and says knowledge of the working class is a strength he will bring to the office. "I have worked and lived in the area for more than 35 years," he said.

One issue facing Hoopeston is the lack of employment in town. "I would like to see more businesses to bring

Public hearing on wind farm ordinance

Vermilion County Board is hosting a public forum to hear comments about the wind farm ordinance and its setback lines or other provisions, at 6:30 p.m. April 15 at Potomac Elementary School. The public is invited to submit comments on the ordinance in person at the meeting or submitted in writing before the meeting by mailing them to County Board Office, Courthouse Annex, 3rd Floor, 6 N Vermilion St., Danville IL 61832.

At the meeting, comments will generally be limited to five minutes. A report on the hearing will be submitted to the full county board after the hearing.

Streff said currently, IEPA loans have an interest rate of 1.9 percent and a 20-year repayment time. The project has been estimated at in excess of \$2.3 million.

In other business, the council unanimously approved paying J&R Tire Recycling \$24,602 under terms of an agreement between the company and the city.

Alderman Bill Goodwine, finance committee chairman, said the payment is part of an agreement that called for the city to use Tax Increment Financing funds to provide incentives for J&R to hire new employees and pay them at least \$25,000 annually. The company opened with 12 employees not under the agreement, but hired an additional 10 employees that meet the guidelines.

The contract called for the incentive to be paid for workers with 12 months of employment. Goodwine said none of the 10 met that guideline but asked the council to make the payment based on the spirit - not the letter - of the agreement.

The contract calls for the city to reimburse J&R a maximum of \$75,000. Beside the wage reimbursement, J&R received \$20,000 for roof work at its plant, the former FMC facility.

In related discussion, Goodwine said the business has added a paint line to make colored rubber mulch from the tires it shreds. The new line will employ an additional six people, he said.

In other action, the council:

- •Approved the ownership transfer of New Wave Communications to Rural Broadband Investments. New Wave representative Monique Lusk said Rural Broadband Investments purchased New Wave and plans to expand it from 90,000 to 100,000 customers to around 300,000 subscribers, she said.
- •Heard from Alderman Randy Carter, street/alley committee chairman, that the city will have a barebones sidewalk replacement program. Homeowners, who must pay 50 percent of costs, are encouraged to sign up quickly.




