#### **County wind committee to meet**

The Vermilion County Wind Advisory Panel will reconvene at noon Thursday in the third floor conference room of the County Board office of the courthouse, 6 N. Vermilion St., Danville.

The panel will consider public comment received at Monday's public hearing at Potomac Grade School.

At that hearing, attended by more than 100 people, Vermilion County Board members heard from residents about the existing wind farm ordinance, particularly whether the board should increase the distance turbines should be built from property lines and other structures.

Under current law, turbines must be set back 1,200 feet from primary structures, such as houses.

A representative from Apex Wind Energy, owner of the Hoopeston Wind Project, said increasing the setback could stop further development.

Public comment will not be accepted at Thursday's meeting.
