# Rate for alternative electricity provider to be set May 15

Mayor Bill Crusinberry will be among representatives of 12 communities to meet at the Days Hotel in Danville on May 15 to decide which supplier to approve under the city's electric aggregation program.

The issue, approved by voters in the April 9 election, means Hoopeston will be among communities in Illinois

that will switch from Ameren electricity to whichever of four companies offers the lowest price, said Jerod McMorris, energy consultant with Good Energy, at a public hearing prior to Tuesday night's Hoopeston City Council meeting.

Good Energy is the company Hoopeston selected as its aggregator.

Residents can expect to save 20-25 percent on the power portion of their bill. Because aggregation affects only the cost of the actual power purchased, savings do not affect transportation and delivery costs, McMorris said.

Once a bid is accepted, the winning company will send letters to residents. Another letter will be sent on city letterhead.

To participate in the aggregation program, residents do nothing. Those who do not wish to switch will have to

opt out, by returning the bottom portion of the letter. "If you want \$20 a month savings, do nothing," McMorris said. "If you want to spend more money, mail the bottom part back in."

Residents who chose Vermilion County's plan with Integrys may opt out of that and into the city's plan. Residents with other providers should call about opt-out costs, he said.

The council held two hearings on electric aggregation and one on the planned water storage tank refurbishing project prior to its regular meeting. At that meeting: • Mayor Bill Crusinberry, Clerk Gail Lane and aldermen were sworn in.
