Rain moved Monday's Memorial Day service from Floral Hill Cemetery to the McFerren Park Civic Center, but that didn't stop the eyes of some attendees from appearing a little damp.

Hoopeston Area High School students, volunteering their band and choral talents at the event, played and sang a variety of patriotic songs. The ceremony also included an invocation by the Rev. Andy Maxwell of Hoopeston United Methodist Church and remarks by Mayor Bill Crusinberry. Hoopeston Area Superintendent Hank Hornbeck was the keynote speaker, telling the audience that "I must admit I was pretty humbled when (Steve Unger) asked me to speak before this group."

Memorial Day is closely aligned with patriotism and "the chill down your spine, the tear in your eye....," Hornbeck said Also included is love of country and gratitude towards those who have served.

games "and once in a while, on TV," he said. The younger generation learns patriotism by watching and imitating those who stand for the national anthem and the pledge, by visiting memorials and learning the words to patriotic songs, such as "The Star Spangled Banner," "God Bless America," and even ones like "Yankee Doodle."

The highest patriotism is shown by those who gave their lives to serve to their country. In Vermilion County, one soldier died in the Afghan war; three died in Iraq, including Jeffrey Wallace, of Hoopeston; 24 died in Vietnam; 34 in Korea; 358 in WW II; and 56 in WWI.

Hornbeck provided a brief history of Memorial Day formerly called Decoration Day - and talked of the tradition of holding the annual service in cemeteries to honor soldiers who had died.
